
COMMODORE'S LETTER

The 2024 Laying Up Supper in November was a great success - more people than ever and a new more relaxed layout created a great atmosphere in the Clubhouse for us to celebrate, reflect and digest the ups and downs of the 2024 season - accompanied by a delicious Coco's meal!

The Clubhouse and all things DYC had its annual refresh in January, building on previous improvements and everything is looking fantastic!

The new range of Club clothing and merchandise was launched and it's great to see people wearing it.

The 100 Club had a slow start but has built momentum over the year with more and more members signing up and the winnings paying out. We have a special draw taking place at the DYC Regatta with forecast prize payout of £85. Entries for this have now closed but entries are still open for future draws with a chance to win £30 each month.

The Committee are delighted to report that they have granted a small parcel of land within the tender park to accommodate a Changing Places Toilet facility. This will be a great addition to Dale – creating opportunites for less abled individuals to access watersports. DYC members will also be able to use this once it's built. We have had some changes on the Committee with Nia and Stuart both stepping down due to personal commitments. We are so grateful for the support and time they have given the Club over their terms and are delighted that Nia will be continuing to support communications by managing the website and social media.

This does leave a vacancy for the Welfare Officer and for a coordinator to help organise Junior Sailing from next year. Nia will be continuing through this season but we would welcome interest from any members or Junior Sailing parents interested in taking this on.

I will be stepping down as Commodore at the end of my three-year term, this November, as is our Club Treasurer, Terence, leaving a further two vacancies on the Committee. Please contact the Club Secretary, Christine, if you would like to discuss joining the Committee or learn more about what the role involves.

It was such a shame that our annual Regatta had to be cancelled last weekend due to high winds and unsafe conditions on the water. While disappointing, safety must always come first. A huge thank you to all the volunteers who were on standby, ready to help and support the event. Your time and commitment are always appreciated.

We have been able to re-schedule the RYA Dragon Series event for Bank Holiday Monday - more information under the Events section.

We are saddened by the news that Michelle and Ella have decided to close Coco's at the end of September. They have provided an excellent offering in the Clubhouse for the past 5 ½ years, since taking over the licence. We thank them both and their incredible team of staff for everything they have done, the commitment they have given to the Club, their amazing food and the atmosphere they have created, and wish them both the best of luck with their future adventures.

Finally, we are gearing up for the Commodore's Ball in October. This will combine the Laying Up Supper for the season - hosted at The Lord Nelson Hotel in Milford Haven - we hope to see as many members and guests there as possible - Saturday 11 October!

The dinghy bay markers have been replaced, clearly delineating each numbered bay. The Club's Toppers are undergoing inspection and pressure testing to determine what needs replacing. Celtic Sea have replaced the trailer wheels for the Fusions as they had perished.

The safety boats continue to be maintained annually with the grateful support of Lyn Jones and Dale Sailing, however they are reaching the end of their lives and it remains a top priority to replace them – hence the fundraising efforts.

Coco's has been a huge success! Beginning in 2018, Michelle Courie took over the licence in 2020. Michelle has worked tirelessly to create a buzzing atmosphere and built a reputation for great food with a range of tapas, Mediterranean inspired mains and their famous pizzas. The RYA Welsh Junior Championships were held in Dale on 21-22 June, co-hosted by DYC, Celtic Sea Watersports and Windswept.

It was an action packed weekend and attracted a total of 74 entries, including 18 sailors keen to develop their racing skills in the coached regatta fleet.

Despite a slow start due to fog and a lack of wind, both the regatta and main fleets were able to launch at lunchtime on the Saturday and sailed until 5pm.

Sunday saw an earlier start with a south-westerly breeze of 10 knots and some big gusts, the main fleet completed five races, and the regatta fleet another three.

This wrapped up a total of eight races for both fleets over the weekend with two discards. Welsh kitefoiler Catrin Williams from the British Sailing Team presented medals to the winning sailors at the prizegiving

CHANGING PLACES

Exciting news – supporting an inclusive future!

We're pleased to share that DYC has supported a request from Pembrokeshire County Council to release a small section of land from the existing Tender Park - an area currently leased by the Club. This land will be used to build a much-needed Changing Places toilet facility for the village. Importantly, it will be accessible to all Club members, further reinforcing DYC's commitment to being an inclusive sailing club for everyone.

Changing Places toilet facilities provide essential, safe, and dignified spaces for people with profound learning disabilities and those with severe mobility challenges. Without such facilities, individuals are often forced to stay at home or face the distress and indignity of being changed on toilet floors, in car parks, or on beaches.

There's still a lot to do - the project must secure planning permission and raise between £80,000-£100,000 to bring the facility to life. Local charity PERKY and Windswept Watersports CIC are leading the initiative, aiming to have the Changing Places toilet facility open and operational by Summer 2027. Until then the identified section of the Tender Park will continue to be used by DYC.


